FP2030 Commitment



SOUTH SUDAN'S FAMILY PLANNING VISION FOR 2030:

Attain 20% Contraceptive Prevalence Rate for Modern Contraceptives for all women, with family planning placed at the center of national development to harness the Demographic Dividend and also ensure the sexual and reproductive rights of women and girls are attained.



1. Increase financing for FP in the national and state budgets

South Sudan will increase the percentage of the national budget for health from 2% to 12% by 2030 and increase the budget allocation for family planning (FP) and reproductive health (RH) from 1% to 5% by 2025. State Governments will allocate 3% of their total budgets to FP/RH, including procuring contraceptives, by 2025.



2. Provide unhindered access to human rights-based Adolescent and Youth Responsive Sexual Reproductive Health (SRH)

South Sudan will harmonize customary laws with national laws, operationalize key strategies such as the Costed Implementation Plan (CIP), and enact the National Disability Inclusion Policy by 2024. Efforts to change gender and social norms through Comprehensive Sexuality Education (CSE), community dialogues, engaging men and boys, and training security forces in SRH will help to ensure community demand and service delivery for integrated rights-based services.



3. Institutionalize and harmonize the generation, collection, storage, analysis, and dissemination of disaggregated data by 2024

The Directorate of Policy Planning Budget and research will manage relationships across the programme and among partners to infuse a data driven culture. They will lead stakeholder engagement to define and update data needs across sectors, and support efforts towards a national data repository. The country will initiate and complete a National Demographic Health Survey by 2026, and the Boma Health Initiative will be supported to develop mechanisms to integrate data from the program into the District Health Information System (DHIS2).



4. Improve system responsiveness to reach hard to reach populations

The government will implement strategies across policy, program, and finance including an annual review of the National Humanitarian Contingency Plan by 2023, rehabilitating health infrastructure in humanitarian affected areas by 2025, strengthening coordination at the national, state, and local levels, promoting public-private partnerships, and allocating budget within the Humanitarian Ministry to SRH services in humanitarian responses.



5. Increase access to Adolescent and Youth Responsive SRH/Information and Contraceptive Services

South Sudan will review the ASRH Strategic Framework for 2020, and enact and review the GBV law and the Family and the Children Act, and put in place mechanisms to end child marriage. Free sanitary pads will be provided to all eligible girls, and CSE will be provided to young people in and out of schools. The government will support the creation of youth-friendly centers and capacity strengthening, and establish a Youth Enterprise Fund to build youth entrepreneurship to support youth economically.



POLITICAL/POLICY COMMITMENT: PROVIDE AN ENABLING ENVIRONMENT FOR THE ATTAINMENT OF FP/SRHR



South Sudan will recruit and hire a Director of Family Planning & Reproductive Health Commodity Security (FP/RHCS) as per MoH-RH directorate approved organogram.



Approach to Accountability

South Sudan will ensure accountability of their commitment through:

1. Existing and new platforms that will be used to track progress on commitments
2. Accountability tools/mechanisms that will be used to track commitments
3. Social accountability mechanisms that will be used at the subnational level
4. Accountability approach that elevates the role of civil society partners and how they will be engaged in tracking progress on commitments
5. Visibility and transparency in sharing information on country progress towards meeting commitments
6. Aligning the FP2030 accountability process with other national processes for monitoring other country commitments such as ICDP+25
