# FP2030 Commitment

## INDIA'S FAMILY PLANNING VISION FOR 2030:

Access to high quality comprehensive Family Planning (FP) services for all people of reproductive age group including those from marginalized groups by ensuring equitable, affordable and appropriate choices and information till the last mile through improved health systems and community engagement within the country's UHC framework.



### 1. Expand the range and reach of contraceptive options by exploring the introduction of new contraceptives.

The government will create a roadmap for the introduction of new contraceptives into the National FP program (Subdermal Contraceptive Implant (Single Rod) and Subcutaneous Injection MPA (MPA-SC), strengthen current strategies, ensure improved access to emergency contraceptive services, and develop innovative models for access. Improved counselling, strengthening the health workforce's capacity for quality FP services, and strengthening the local governance structures will help to ensure equity and responsiveness.




### 2. Improve demand, uptake, and quality of post-pregnancy contraception services to ensure healthy timing and spacing of pregnancies.

Strengthening post-partum and post-abortion care FP counselling and monitoring will sustain gains made towards India's FP2020 commitments. Emerging trends during the COVID-19 pandemic such as an increase in PPIUCD insertion will inform future focuses, such as strengthening adequate infection control and sterilization services for IUCD insertion.



### 5. Generate civil society commitments to create awareness of FP commodities and services and mobilize the community for uptake.



### 3. Scale up Mission Parivar Vikas (MPV) to deliver assured quality services in the hardest-to-reach and urban areas through full-service health packages at all levels in the MPV Districts.

MPV works across five tenets within a rights-based framework to accelerate access to high-quality contraceptive services by addressing demand-side and supply-side gaps. To strengthen the MPV program, the government will focus on innovative communication campaigns to engage men, youth, and communities. Advocacy efforts will also be expanded to engage key stakeholders at the policy and governance levels.



### 4. Intensify Social and Behavior Change (SBC) for FP and strengthen access to information and services for girls, women, and couples, with a specific focus on young people.

The government will ensure services across the spectrum of care throughout the life course for all girls, women, and couples with a specific focus on young people. Stakeholders will work across policy, services, and information generation and dissemination to improve the demand for family planning and reproductive health services, holistically respond to needs, address challenges, and strengthen existing systems.

To generate demand for reproductive health services and improve awareness of family Planning, Government will strengthen community engagement efforts that address social determinants of health, empower people to make informed decisions and address individual community needs, by utilizing digital innovations and forging new partnerships.

# Approach to Accountability


India's commitment is aligned with existing government programs including Accredited Social Health Activists (ASHAs), the National Adolescent Health Program (RKSK), and their flagship program: Mission Parivar Vikas (MPV), among others.

The government will focus on a robust feedback mechanism in which information is disseminated through a top-down approach through review meetings, supportive supervision visits, etc.



## INDIA'S DATA ROADMAP TO ACHIEVE FP2030 COMMITMENTS

- 1 Emphasize qualitative metadata**  
in addition to quantitative data for well-rounded programs.
- 2 Strengthen platforms for sharing**  
feedback with program implementers to ensure focused efforts.
- 3 Build capacity of program managers to record and report**  
accurate data, conduct data analysis, and use the data to inform programmatic priorities.
- 4 Involve partners**  
for conducting evaluation studies and increasing accountability and funding towards improving data management.
- 5 Map technical partners and utilize their services**  
to support periodic data analysis and improvements.
